ARDLUI

Station, Hotel, Cafes, Restaurants, Drover's Inn (2 miles), Caravan Park & Marina

Access to the high hills. Ferry to the eastern shore and the West Highland Way. Beautiful, yet more peaceful than it once was when the ancient kingdoms of Picts and Western Scots battled over their territories.

INVERUGLAS

Cafe & Toilets

Stunning walks to Loch Sloy and high mountains. End of the Three Lochs Way. Glen Loin links to Arrochar. Close to Loch Sloy Hydroelectric Power Station.

TARBET

Cafes, Restaurants, Toilets, Station (1/2 mile)

Walks from station and from Tarbet Isle car park. End of West Loch Lomond cycle route. Large grassed lochside picnic location. Vikings launched longboats here after hauling them over the hill from the sea at Arrochar. 5,000 navies built the West Highland Railway, which runs along the length of Loch Lomond. Of these 37 were buried just outside the graveyard.

INVERBEG

Hotel, Art Gallery & Caravan Park

Walk up Glen Douglas (not waymarked) with great views across the loch. Gallery. Inverbeg Inn has been in business since 1814.

LUSS

Cafes, Restaurants, Accommodation, Toilets, Information & Shops

Historic conservation village, often busy, immortalised in the *Take the High Road* soap opera on STV. Beach, village loop walk (easy - 1 hour). The Luss hills, more strenuous walk (not way marked). Take pedestrian bridge over A82 and start at stile past the last house. Great views across the loch. Local Highland Games are a highlight of the social calendar.

CAMERON HOUSE

Hotel

A house with a history as colourful as its stunning views. Luxury bars, restaurants and so much more in fine setting.

LOCH LOMOND SHORES

Cafes, Restaurants, Toilets, Shops, Information, Canoes & Cycle Hire

Wide range of retail, Loch Lomond Aquarium, historic Maid of the Loch steamer, cycle and canoe hire from the bay. Seasonal promotions, markets, crafts, fairground attractions and other events make this a fun visit.

WEST HIGHLAND LINE

A world renowned rail journey that can be combined with a trip on Loch Lomond.

WEST LOCH LOMOND CYCLE ROUTE

It's easy to combine cycling on this route with a journey on the loch to make itineraries of a day or even longer.

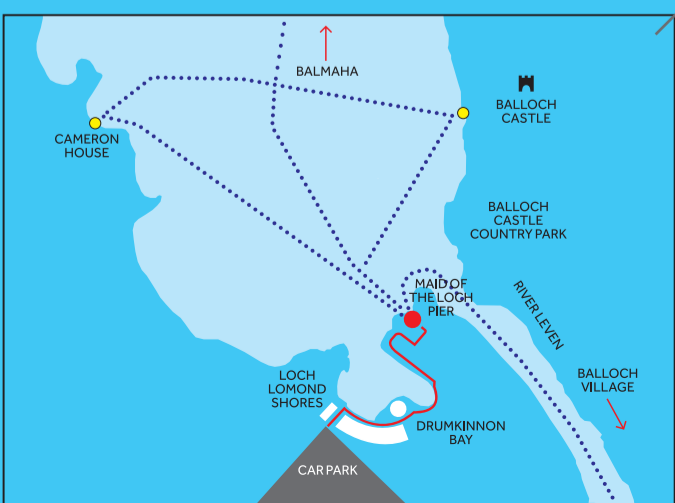
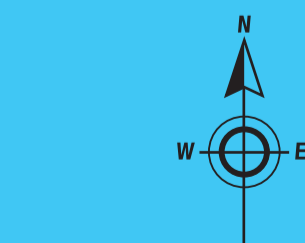

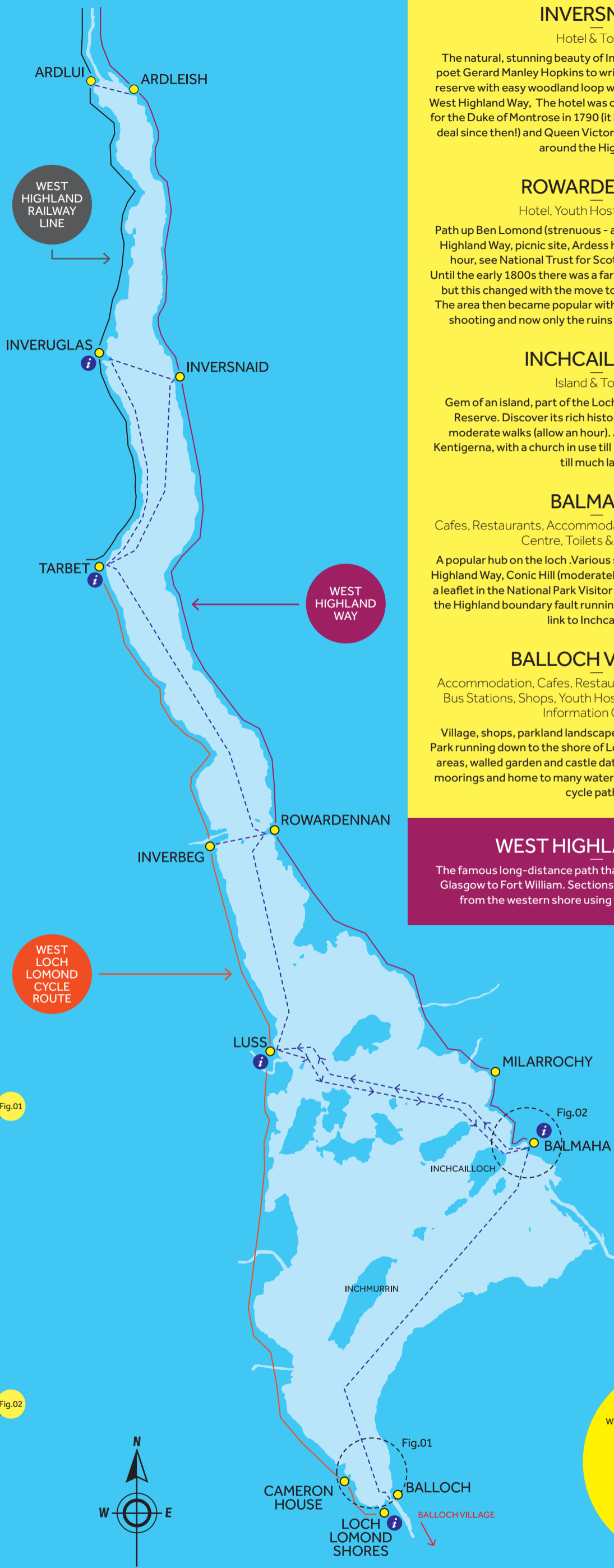

INVERRNAID

Hotel & Toilets

The natural, stunning beauty of Inversnaid waterfall inspired poet Gerard Manley Hopkins to write 'Inversnaid'. RSPB nature reserve with easy woodland loop walk (1 hour), Rob Roy's Cave, West Highland Way. The hotel was originally a hunting lodge built for the Duke of Montrose in 1790 (it has been modernised a great deal since then!) and Queen Victoria visited on her famed trips around the Highlands.

ROWARDENNAN

Hotel, Youth Hostel & Toilets

Path up Ben Lomond (strenuous - allow 5 hours), walk the West Highland Way, picnic site, Ardess hidden history trail (easy - 1 hour, see National Trust for Scotland's leaflet for details). Until the early 1800s there was a farming community in this area, but this changed with the move to largescale sheep farming. The area then became popular with the upper classes for game shooting and now only the ruins of the properties remain.

INCHCAILLOCH

Island & Toilets

Gem of an island, part of the Loch Lomond National Nature Reserve. Discover its rich history and wildlife on easy to moderate walks (allow an hour). Also rich heritage from St Kentigerna, with a church in use till 1770 and the cemetery used till much later.

BALMAHA

Cafes, Restaurants, Accommodation, National Park Visitor Centre, Toilets & Cycle Hire

A popular hub on the loch. Various scenic loch side walks, West Highland Way, Conic Hill (moderately strenuous 3 hours). Pick up a leaflet in the National Park Visitor Centre. You can actually see the Highland boundary fault running across the loch here. Ferry link to Inchaillach.

BALLOCH VILLAGE

Accommodation, Cafes, Restaurants, Toilets, Railway and Bus Stations, Shops, Youth Hostel (2 miles) & VisitScotland Information Centre

Village, shops, parkland landscape of Balloch Castle Country Park running down to the shore of Loch Lomond, with walks, play areas, walled garden and castle dating from 1808. River Leven, moorings and home to many water birds, connecting walks and cycle paths.

WEST HIGHLAND WAY

The famous long-distance path that runs from the outskirts of Glasgow to Fort William. Sections of the route can be tackled from the western shore using the water bus services.
